

Richard Hennessey, Class Facilitator The Teaching of Anthony de Mello

The Teachings of Anthony de Mello



October of 2018 Richard Hennessey, LCSW, began a Friday evening program at St. Mary's Episcopal Church on **The Teachings of Anthony de Mello**. Tony de Mello, a native of India, was a Jesuit priest, psychologist, spiritual director, and modern day mystic. His teachings were thought provoking and quite radical. He drew from many diverse spiritual traditions, especially melding Buddhism with Christianity.

As stated by his brother Bill, "Without doubt...the most significant change that came into Tony's teachings was the introduction of Vipassana meditation." Tony was 55 years old when he died in 1987.

Tony de Mello taught through retreats, workshops, seminars, and books, most of which were published posthumously. Known for his warmth, wit, and wisdom, he did much of his teaching through stories. He focused on love. As Tony said: "The best religion in the world is the religion called 'love'....There is only one need: the need to love."

Richard began his class in October presenting "A Rediscovery of Life," the video of a 1-day seminar de Mello gave at Fordham University in 1986. Richard has followed this with a <u>book</u> study on *Awareness*, a transcript of Tony's 4-day "Wake Up

To Life" seminar, also given at Fordham in 1986. Currently, classes begin with a short meditation on Fridays, followed by Richard playing segments of the audio of the seminar. Group reaction/discussions and facilitator's comments lead to an evening that is insightful, enlightening and informative. So, while recommended, a book is not necessary.

The program is free, Fridays 7-8:30pm. Everyone is invited. There is plenty of room.

The book study of Awareness is drop in, so one can join now or at anytime. Once the book study of *Awareness* is complete by year's end, Richard will once again present "A Rediscovery of Life."



Richard Hennessey, LCSW, discovered Anthony de Mello 28 years ago and in 1999 began offering de Mello workshops, locally since 2011, focusing on "A Rediscovery of Life" and Tony's book *Awareness*. Richard has practiced psychotherapy for over 40 years in various clinical settings and teaches Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction (MBSR). He has taught MBSR locally at Straub and Wilcox Medical Centers, Schofield Barracks, KKV Comprehensive Family Services, United Self-Help, Unity Church of Hawaii, Chinatown Peace Center, and now at the Bodhi Tree Meditation Center.
